



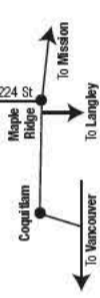

PROGRAM OPTIONS

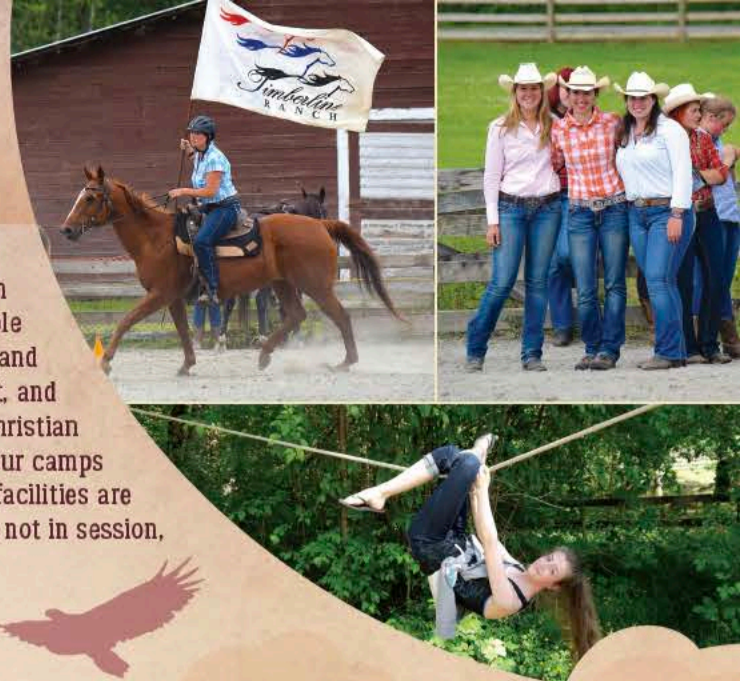
There's never enough time to do everything at camp, so choose with your camper the option that best fits their desires and your family budget.

- 1. Western Lessons** (base+\$40)
The most riding and horsemanship training of any of our summer options. Highlights include four riding lessons, two trail rides, and many of the regular camp activities.
- 2. Trails Galore** (base+\$20)
For those who just have to be on a horse and on the trails, this option includes four or five trail rides and the most popular of our other activities.
- 3. Super Mix** (base+\$10)
For the camper who simply wants it all, this option includes three trail rides and a fantastic variety of other activities.
- 4. Rocks & Ropes** (base price)
If you love adventure, this option is geared toward you. Includes two trail rides, climbing, challenge course, and a great variety of the more lively activities, such as BMX biking, sports, and so on.
- 5. Extreme Team** (base price; co-ed camps only)
If you love the outdoors, but not so much the horses, this option will keep your blood pumping! You will enjoy a wide variety of our most intense activities, plus a 2-3 hour out-trip.
- 6. Kick-Off Camps**
These flexible, shorter camps are ideal for first-time campers and for families looking for a fantastic, inexpensive experience for their kids. The program for these camps is the same for everyone, including the most popular activities.

Timberline Ranch is a fully accredited member of the BC Camping Association and is also part of the Fellowship of Christian Camps in BC. It is located just seven minutes north of downtown Maple Ridge. We are a Christian-run, charitable society, established in 1961, providing safe and fun programs for young people and families. We encourage each person to begin and grow in a relationship with God through Jesus Christ, and we provide opportunities for people to examine the Christian faith in an enjoyable, non-threatening atmosphere. Our camps are open to people of all cultures and faiths. Ranch facilities are available for rental any time of year when camps are not in session, and they may be reserved up to a year in advance.



REGISTRATION

Registration begins at noon on January 4, 2017. You may register online (TimberlineRanch.com), by fax (print form from the website and fax to 604-463-4346), or by mail. We cannot process applications over the phone, but we will mail you a form if you do not have internet access. Tax will be added to all camps except day camps.

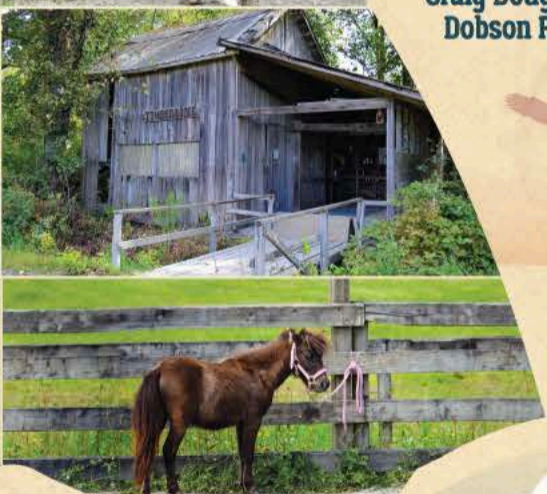

IMPORTANT NOTES:

Please read specific policies on our website, especially regarding homesickness, lice, lost and found, cameras, medical care, and so on.

Each camper and staff member must provide proof of coverage of Provincial Health or equivalent medical insurance.

The camp director reserves the right to dismiss any camper who, in his opinion, is a hazard to the safety and/or rights of others.

Due to limited space, campers may only sign up for one camp per summer, until June 1.

No refunds will be issued for early departures, late arrivals, or dismissals. Please see our homesickness policy online.

Summer campers may receive emails through our website: TimberlineRanch.com. Regular mail is also accepted and distributed.

Emergency calls to or from campers can be made through our office. Otherwise, campers are not permitted to make or receive calls, and they are not permitted to bring cell phones.

Smoking is not permitted during children's camps, and it is otherwise permitted only in the parking lot.

Visitors' pets must be kept on a leash and out of buildings, and they may not be kept overnight at the Ranch.

Timberline reserves the right to use tasteful photographs and/or video images of campers for promotional purposes. Attendance at a camp signifies acceptance of this policy.

Our General Store or "Tuck Shop" has many treats and souvenir items, and it is open on the last day of each summer camp and once or twice during seasonal camps. Summer campers receive treats daily, included in their fees.
