NEW "SPECIALTY" OPTIONS

Each camper will choose 2 Specialty Options when registering. These are in addition to the 12 Core Activities (see below). Each will run once per day for four days. Most options will be available each week. Shorter camps enjoy the "CORE" activities only, and day camps run a separate schedule completely.

BARN OPTIONS (max. 1 per camper):

Riding Lessons (+\$40) – Four great lessons, and then showcase your skills at Rodeo

Drill Team (+\$30) – Learn to perform a drill pattern on horseback and perform it at Rodeo

Trails 'n' Games (+\$20) – Two extra trail rides and two sessions of mounted games

Vaulting Team (+\$10) – Spend four days learning awesome vaulting moves to perform at Rodeo

Western Mix – Learn all about horses, grooming, and tacking, and learn to rope like a pro

OTHER OPTIONS:

Targets (+\$15) – Improve your accuracy in archery, riflery, sling shots, and the Nerf™ Battle Zone

Crafts Plus (+\$5) – Indulge your creative side with two 2-day crafts or one 4-day craft

Drama Team – Practice skits and dramas to perform in front of the entire camp

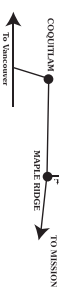

REGISTRATION

Registration is online at www.timberlineranch.com and will begin at noon on January 4. Those preferring not to register online may print the registration forms from our website and mail or fax them to us (604-463-4346). Please be aware that online is the quickest way to register, and all other ways will result in a delay. If you do not have access to the internet, please call us (604-463-9278), and we will mail or fax the forms to you. We are unable to process registrations over the phone or via email. Tax will be added to all camps except day camps.

Exceptions to this policy may be made if TR is provided with a physician's note outlining the medical reasons for the cancellation; however, the deposit of \$75 (summer) or \$25 (seasonal) per applicant (e.g. each paying member of a family) is non-refundable and non-transferable regardless of circumstances. Transfers to other dates may be made for a \$20 administrative fee, up to four weeks in advance. After that it will be considered a cancellation. Refunds are not given for those who leave once a camp has started.

CAMP STORE

The "Tuck Shop" has numerous treats, such as candy, pop, and frozen items, as well as a great selection of clothing and souvenirs. Summer campers receive treats every day, included in their fees. Purchases may be made on the first and last day. The store is usually open once or twice during seasonal camps.

TIMBERLINE RANCH

is fully accredited with the BC Camping Association and is a member of the Fellowship of Christian Camps in BC. It is located just seven minutes north of downtown Maple Ridge. We are a charitable Christian society, established in 1961, that provides safe and fun programs for young people and families. We encourage each person to begin and grow in a relationship with God through Jesus Christ, and we provide opportunities for people to examine the Christian faith in an enjoyable, non-threatening atmosphere. Our camps are open to people of all cultures and faiths. Ranch facilities are available for rental any time of year when camps are not in session, and they may be reserved up to a year in advance.

Homeschool Camps (9-16)

Running four consecutive Mondays, these camps offer campers a positive, safe, and fun environment to learn new skills, make new friends, and enjoy the beautiful Ranch setting. One camp per person, please.

Junior Wrangler (13-17)

This fantastic camp is designed for "pre-staff" and new staff who want to learn the basics of horse care and riding skills. It's a fun weekend spent with, on, and around the horses!

Ladies Craft Weekend (16+)

For those who just want to get away, be pampered, socialize, and have all day to work on projects and/or relax, this weekend can't be much better! Camp begins at 4:00 on Friday and includes Friday supper.

Parent and Kid Camp (9+)

This is for any parent who wants to spend some quality time with one of their children. Dads & daughters, moms & sons, whatever! Spend the weekend together, enjoying fun outdoor activities, great food, hilarious activities, and an inspirational speaker. You don't want to miss this one!

Trail Blazers I & II (12-16)

What can be better than camping? Camping with horses! Pack up, tack up, and head for the hills. TBI is a pre-requisite for TBII.

Spring Break-Out & Fall Blast (9-14)

These two popular camps fill up quickly. Run like mini summer camps, they are filled with activities, skits, campfires, great food, and a genuine feel of community. Sign up early!

LIT - Leaders in Training (16-18)

Aimed at grade 10-12 students who want to learn leadership skills in a camp setting, this week may change your life! It's the primary transition point between being a camper and working on staff, and we will build into you skills, qualities, and knowledge to make you a successful leader at camp and beyond. LITs must complete the staff application process, including an application, references, and an interview.

SALT - Summer Advanced Leadership Training (17-19)

This intensive Christian leadership program is for LIT graduates who want to grow in their relationships with God and learn to serve in a camp setting. Time will be split between learning, mentoring relationships, and summer camp involvement throughout these three weeks. A very limited number will be accepted.

SWAT - Summer Workers at Timberline (18+)

Our SWAT Team makes up the core group of summer leaders for our camp all summer. Members receive a bursary toward their education and must be attending post-secondary in September to qualify. A few paid positions are also available, especially for those with specific skills needed.

Seasonal Staff Team (18+)

Every spring and fall, Timberline hires 10-12 individuals to work as wranglers, kitchen workers, housekeepers, and program staff. These positions run April to June and September to October.

Staff Training Weekend (16+)

This is a mandatory (but enjoyable!) training time for each person who has been accepted through the staff application process and intends to work at Timberline during the summer, including those in LIT, SALT, and SWAT.

Family Camps (All)

Get your family away from home for a time of fun and refreshment! Thanksgiving Camp begins at 1:00 pm. Children under eight may go on pony rides (but not trail rides), and they receive a reduced rate. Childcare is available. Sign up early, as these camps often fill up quickly!

DEAR PARENTS,

We are very excited to present a number of wonderful changes this year, including bathrooms and showers in all of the cabins, a new program schedule, and brand new activity options!

These changes have been made as we have listened to and read your feedback. All full-week campers will now enjoy a set of 12 Core Activities, which includes many of the most popular activities such as trail rides, archery, and challenge course, PLUS they will choose 2 Specialty Options, which they will enjoy four mornings throughout the week. Basic fees are the same as last year in order that we can charge a bit extra for the more costly Specialty Options. Specialty Options will be on a first-come first-served basis, and there will be no waitlists for these options. We believe that these changes will allow campers to spend more time enjoying their favorite activities and will promote better instruction during the Specialty Options. Please consult with your children before registering them, as the Specialty Options will be chosen during the registration process. Only one "BARN" option may be chosen per camper.

Rodeos this summer will be running prior to the BBQ supper, on the last day of camp, in order to allow more time and to give campers greater involvement. We believe this will provide a better Rodeo for all involved.

Our staff and volunteers are energetic, caring, incredibly fun, and committed to live out their Christian faith. They are carefully screened and selected for their integrity, maturity, and ability to work with young people in a camp setting. Many have very specialized training and high levels of achievement in activity areas such as horsemanship and rock-climbing. They are trained to put the safety of all campers first and to respond quickly and correctly in the case of an emergency. We have established an excellent safety record over these many years, and we all work hard to maintain it.

It is our desire to provide young people opportunities to develop in their whole persons: physically, emotionally, spiritually, and socially. While we do all we can to give campers "the time of their lives," we also provide opportunities for their character development, in an environment of love and acceptance.
